## DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Read **Luke 19:1-10**. What points or applications from the sermon particularly resonated with you? What questions do you have from the passages that were preached?
2. Jesus says that He came not only to *save* the lost but to *seek* them in order to *save* them. What does this teach us about our hearts, that we need Jesus to seek us? What does this teach us about Jesus' heart that He is willing to seek us? How does this affect the way you think about those who are near to you but far from God?
3. Read **2 Corinthians 5:17-21**. What does it mean to be an ambassador? How would your life be different if you were an ambassador from another country living in America? How does that perspective help you understand your identity as an “ambassador for Christ”?
4. Read **John 17:18**, **Luke 19:10**, and **2 Corinthians 5:20**. Discuss how these verses complement each other. Why does God choose to use us to complete His mission? How does the bigness of the mission drive us back to “Being with Prayer”?
5. How does the fact that Jesus describes His ministry as a mission to seek and save the lost challenge and encourage you? How does this motivate you to be more diligent to “Share the Gospel” as you seek to be used by God to represent Jesus to those He has brought into your life?

6. As a group, share experiences where you had an opportunity to “Share the Gospel” but you either missed it or took advantage of it. What has surprised you in the gospel conversations you’ve had? What has frustrated you in those conversations?
7. The desire in LIFE Fellowship’s vision is that people would not only have an opportunity to *hear* the gospel but also that they would have an opportunity to *respond*. How does thinking about giving others the opportunity to both *hear* and *respond* challenge the way you think about what it means to “Share the Gospel”?
8. What are the primary fears and obstacles that keep you from sharing the gospel? What shifts are needed in your values and priorities to overcome those things?
